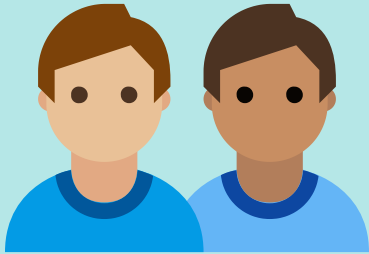

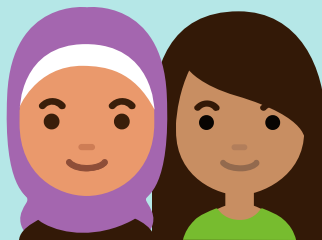
Our home visiting programs, **Birth to Three** and **Children's Long-Term Support Waiver**, provided in partnership with Milwaukee County, never shut down during the pandemic. Social workers and therapists quickly transitioned from providing home-based services to leading telehealth sessions by video, phone and email.

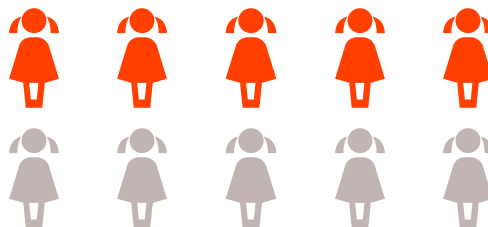
Children with special needs and/or developmental delays

Our **Family Activity Center (FAC)**, which provides free and low-cost programming and events for all families of kids with special needs, closed in-person programming to protect the health of participants. Since the primary goals of the FAC are to help caregivers of children with special needs reduce isolation and build networks of support, our FAC Coordinator led activities and support groups over Zoom to help parents feel connected during the closure. *- next page*

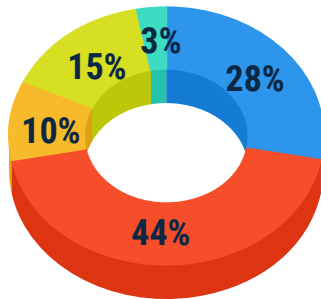
Our **Early Childhood Education** Center, serving kids with and without special needs in our inclusive classrooms, closed during the Safer at Home Order from March through May 2020. During that time, our educators explored virtual learning options and provided lesson plans, videos and remote check-ins to help parents with at-home learning. On May 27, 2020, we reopened our doors to the smiling faces of our babies, toddlers, preschoolers and kindergartners! 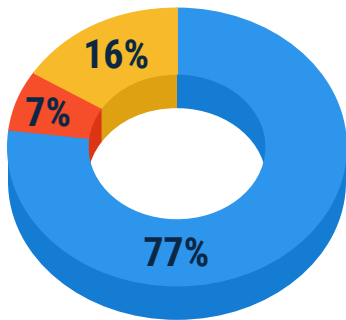
